A special unit or team of prosecutors and paraprofessionals that would be available to provide assistance and support to the rural prosecution effort could have a significant positive impact on prosecutions in rural Alaska and, ultimately, reduce the level of crime in these communities.

This project will provide a flexible prosecution team available to provide back-up and assistance all over rural Alaska on an as needed basis. This team would consist of three prosecutors, a paralegal and a secretary in an office located in Anchorage. The prosecutors and paralegal would provide support to rural offices throughout the state and be available to travel to any rural office when necessary. In addition, this rural prosecution team would be responsible for providing advice, conducting training and developing policy specifically intended to more effectively deliver services to rural Alaska.

In the next 13 months, three federal grants that employ approximately 17 FTEs are terminating. Twelve of these positions are exclusively devoted to sexual assault or domestic violence and the remainder prosecute primarily sexual assault and domestic violence. The Department is hoping to replace these funds with other yet to be identified federal funds. Pending the identification of another funding source, the Department is requesting a \$2,307.0 fund source switch from Federal funds to General funds. This fund source switch will allow the department to continue to fund additional attorneys and paralegals in Bethel, Barrow and Anchorage to aid in the prosecution of domestic violence as well as adult and child sexual assault cases.

The \$2307.0 fund source is made up of: 2nd Judicial: Earmark \$90.0, and Rural Prosecution & Sexual Assault \$90.1. 3rd Judicial-Anchorage: Rural Prosecution & Sexual Assault \$335.6. 3rd Judicial-Outside Anchorage: Rural Prosecution & Sexual Assault \$454.6. 4th Judicial: Earmark \$285.0, and Rural Prosecution & Sexual Assault \$11.1. OSPA: Earmark \$271.6. and Rural Prosecution & Sexual Assault \$769.0.

Designing, building, and rolling out this system has been a long and complicated process due to Alaska's far flung geography and remoteness of some of the District Attorney offices. The capital appropriation we had for this project through an RSA with the Governor's Office is exhausted. Annual maintenance and operation of this system is an operating budget expense and this increment is needed to prevent the loss of a prosecutor or victim witness paralegal that would otherwise be eliminated in order to pay this bill. CRIMES is a critical tool in the prosecution of crime.

Last session, the Governor's Office suggested that there be an increase in the number of investigators in the Medicaid Fraud Unit. This would be a good investment of state funds both because the federal government pays 75% of the cost for these positions and because the amount of fines and restitution this unit obtains is generally larger than any other unit of the criminal division. Presently there are three Investigator III positions and a Forensic Accountant IV. This request is for two additional Investigator IIIs (PCNs 03-#020, -#021) and one Investigator IV (PCN 03-#022). The Investigator IV would supervise the other investigators.

The unit's investigators perform high level investigations of medical professional service providers who are suspected or known to have committed Medicaid fraud, patient abuse or misappropriation of patient assets. They locate and gather information, evidence and/or testimony to be used in litigation and administrative actions, to detect/verify suspected violation of state law, fraud, licensing violations and the like.

In 2002, under a legislative mandate, the collections unit began collecting and distributing restitution owed to victims in criminal cases. The caseload and backlog is increasing dramatically: In 2002, the adult restitution active caseload was 800; by 2010 this rose to over 6,500. The staffing shortage also negatively affects the unit's ability to send money to victims. Over 11,000 payments are collected but not disbursed. Some payments due to victims are are more than two years old. New cases have not been opened, impacting garnishment of the 2010 PFD in those cases. Current restitution staff consists of one paralegal and two office assistants, plus the original funding first appropriated for this purpose in 2002. In addition to this base increment request (Anchorage Paralegal I, PFT 03-#019 and funding), the department is also requesting a multi-year FY2011 supplemental appropriation of \$750.0 and three non-permanent positions to help significantly reduce or eliminate the backlog in collections from offenders and payments to victims.

We have challenged the listing of the Polar Bear as a threatened species, and are reviewing the Beluga listing and we anticipate a large influx in ESA cases since many species may be listed in the near future. Endangered species listings can have severe impacts on the economy of the area where they are found.

An example of federal actions requiring state intervention are the currently ongoing revisions of federal land management plans. Active state involvement is important because these plan revisions will guide activities in and access through national parks, wildlife refuges (including ANWR), forests, NPR-A and BLM land in Alaska. Other examples include BLM proposals to vacate existing easements through ANCSA conveyances to public lands. And to preserve access on RS 2477 rights-of-way, the state will initiate quiet title actions against the federal government (for the purpose of planning requirements, Utah, another state aggressively seeking title to its RS 2477 rights-of-way, has tasked seven attorneys to gather evidence and prepare its RS 2477 cases for filing). For instance, section attorneys are engaged in multiple lawsuits and administrative proceedings involving federal Endangered Species Act decisions. As an example of a position the state takes in these actions, the state opposes listing healthy populations of animals based on speculative models of climate 100 years in the future; the state urges the use of shorter, more accurate time frames. In the timber arena, section attorneys are pursuing an appeal in the 9th Circuit to reinstate an Alaska-specific exemption to the federal Roadless Rule. Simultaneously, the section is seeking to overturn the Roadless Rule through a declaratory judgment action in Washington, D.C. With regard to mineral development, the section is providing critical advice to assure that the permits the state issues are well supported. The section is also defending against administrative appeals and lawsuits opposing mineral development, particularly in southwest Alaska. Other work already engaging section attorneys includes navigability, submerged land and public water issues (such as the Peratorvich case concerning whether pockets of federal fisheries management exist within larger state management areas), and all fish and game management issues.

Alaska is by far the largest of the states in geographical size with distances and obstacles to travel that are substantial and unique. Outside of Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau, the population of Alaska largely resides in literally hundreds of small towns and villages spread throughout a vast geographical area. Rural Alaska has special law enforcement needs that derive from its geographical size and the isolation of most of its rural communities where alcohol is the root of most criminal problems. While the effort to cut off alcohol availability is underway, the intent of this proposal would be to aggressively prosecute crimes resulting from that availability, thus attacking the problem from two fronts. A special unit or team of prosecutions and paraprofessionals that would be available to provide assistance and support to the rural prosecution effort could have a significant positive impact on prosecutions in rural Alaska and, ultimately, reduce the level of crime in these communities.

This project will provide a flexible prosecution team available to provide back-up and assistance all over rural Alaska on an as needed basis. This team would consist of three prosecutors, a paralegal and a secretary in an office located in Anchorage. The prosecutors and paralegal would provide support to rural offices throughout the state and be available to travel to any rural office when necessary. In addition, this rural prosecution team would be responsible for providing advice, conducting training and developing policy specifically intended to more effectively deliver services to rural Alaska.
