In addition, the \$305.0 I mentioned above is being used to train 28 individuals at the Delta Mine Training Center.

This funding was part of step down authority from the unlimited pandemic allocation. Last year, Sabrina Javier told us the Legislature was not interested in allowing this authority to remain unlimited. As we were unsure of potential expenditures that were "leftover" from pandemic activities, this amount was thought to be sufficient for FY23 operations. Indeed, the allocation is adequate and is keeping operations heathy for this fiscal year. However, it was a one time amount based on uncertainty. As you previously asked about, we are refining the number based on reality, and DETS is only asking for \$6,378.1 in FY24. A step down of another \$3.6 million approximately from FY23. That new lowest federal authority amount should be adequate for ongoing operations in UI.
