Agency Comments

PDA expended 18% of additional funding in FY23 and anticipates full expenditure of the remaining funding during FY24. This funding has enabled increased contracting to private counsel and has provided significant relief to offices experiencing high caseload backlogs. This increased funding has resulted in caseload stabilization in the 4th Judicial district eliminating the risk of the Agency being unable to accept ongoing appointments.

OPA did implement new case caps and contract rates, however there was a delay in implementation to ensure caps were competitive while remaining financially feasible. This makes it unlikely for the balance to be fully expended in FY24 and the agency has requested an extension into FY25. The new case caps are increasing at approximately 30-40% for criminal and civil cases, and they are also increasing the hourly rate of pay for all new contracts and renewed contracts per the below ranged schedule.

Agency Comments

OPA utilized the fund for hourly and flat fee contracts to help address the case backlog. Some progress has been made as slightly more cases are being closed out than new cases opened.

Regarding the \$3,300.0 UGF for increased contract attorney support, the agency is in the process of updating the case caps via the regulatory process and that should be finalized soon. The updated case caps are with Department of Law (Legislation, Regulations & Legislative Research Section) awaiting finalization. This will allow OPA to fully bring these resources to bear.

The backlog remains a challenge but OPA, PDA, and the Department of law are working with the Judicial Branch to implement a new process to facilitate faster case resolution. Part of the answer to #5 (above) is in conjunction with the increase in contract dollars being asked about here in item #6.

Regarding the filled PCNs:

The 4 positions related to HB325 were all filled by August of 2023.

The OCS age-out PG PCN was filled at the beginning of January.

The two Public Guardian PCNs were filled almost immediately – The agency was able to use a double fill of existing PCNs while these were being confirmed as approved, to maximize a speedy response to the issue at hand.

Agency Comments

With the exception of one position in the Bethel office, which has historically been difficult to fill for Attorney positions, all positions added in response to HB325 have been filled.

The Training Director role has be filled as of December 2023.

Contractual caseload stabilization funding for PDA is anticipated to be fully expended in FY24 and is funding increased contractor rates, increased cases contacted, and travel expenses to provide rural caseload relief by attorneys in urban locations. Although caseloads related to serious felonies have stabilized in many locations, ongoing recruitment and retention challenges in the legal sphere and Alaska have impacted the ability of the PDA to resolve these caseload backlogs in all locations.
