**Project Description/Justification:**

- Ensure departmental and sub-recipient compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by conducting reviews of department agencies, sub-recipients and complaints on a timely basis.
- Facilitate communications between the department and federally recognized tribes to ensure informed decisions are made regarding project development and execution.
- Develop, implement and revise the DBE and Support Services programs in compliance with federal regulations (49 CFR Part 26).
- Update the Alaska Disparity Study to verify the continuing need for DBE goals on highway and airport projects.
- Verify contractor compliance with required federal aid provisions of their contract through

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- reviews covering ExEEO, DBE participation, and OJT efforts on an annual basis, pursuant to federal regulation 23 CFR 230 and 49 CFR 26.
- Assure departmental compliance with accessibility requirements of Section 504/ADA, and Alaska Administrative Order 129 by developing and updating transition plans for department facilities, reviewing department facilities for accessibility and employee accommodation requests and complaints on a timely basis.
  - Administer the Alaska a statewide unified Unified Certification Program covering DBEs for highway, airport and transit contract opportunities under the authority of the U.S. Department of Transportation.
  - Assure department compliance with FHWA regulations that require On-the-Job Training (OJT).
  - Promote increased participation of minority business enterprises in federal highway contracts, as well as entry level employment opportunities for minorities and women, in part through the development and implementation of cost effective supportive services programs.
