Project Description/Justification:

State Homeland Security grants are annually awarded to the department from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security. Congress annually determines the funding amounts, allocation methods, and grant requirements.

Grants to Alaska typically have an 80% pass-through requirement. Pass-through funds go to communities statewide for infrastructure installation and maintenance for emergency preparedness and response in the event of a catastrophe or emergency. Funding at the state level provides for crisis management, emergency notifications, infrastructure analysis, project mitigation, policy development, and grant administration.

This request supports DMVA's priority to provide disaster preparedness, response and recovery. It is the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management's mission to protect lives and property from terrorism and all other hazards and provide rapid recovery from all disaster events.
