**Project Description/Justification:**

The Aleknagik Wood River Bridge will provide access across Lake Aleknagik to the North Shore. A bridge is needed to provide safe passage between the North and South Shores of the community. Many deaths have occurred due to unsafe traveling conditions during fall freeze-up and spring break-up. There are children on the South Shore that need to cross the lake to attend the Aleknagik School (K-8) on the North Shore, and High School students that cross the lake to catch a bus to Dillingham to attend the High School.

This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.
