Other Related Projects have received prior appropriations as follows: Alaska Spill Response Depots and Corps System \$300.0 in FY2004; Spill Response VHF Communications Upgrade \$300.0 in FY2005; Statewide Hazardous Materials Response \$300.0 in FY2005, Oil and Hazardous Substance First Responder Equipment and Preparedness \$750.0 in FY2010.

Project Description/Justification:

Risks and impacts from new spills will be reduced around the state (in Arctic and non-Arctic locations) by: developing additional geographic response strategies with detailed nearshore response plans to protect critical environmentally sensitive areas from oil spills; purchasing additional emergency towing systems to provide an emergency response capability for vessels in distress; developing potential places of refuge for vessel casualties and maintaining the statewide hazmat response capabilities. The Department last received funding for first responder equipment in the FY2010 budget which primarily focused on non-Arctic areas.

The preparedness for oil and hazardous substance spills contributes to the Department's End Result A - The Environment is Protected.
