Project Description/Justification:

This request is to amend the original appropriation to allow for the receipt of additional funding from the US Department of Veterans Affairs for the Interior Alaska Veterans Cemetery project.

This project provides for the planning, design, and construction of a dedicated State Veterans Cemetery in Fairbanks to serve the burial needs of veterans in the interior of Alaska. Currently veterans in this region must travel to Anchorage or Sitka, 350 and 750 miles respectively, to reach the nearest veterans' cemetery with available grave space.

The US Department of Veterans Affairs has analyzed cemetery projects nationwide and determined that project costs have risen from initial funding estimates, and is providing additional funding to meet these costs.
