Funding Details:

A FY2011 CIP in the amount of \$150,000 has been approved but Denali Commission funding is no longer available. As a result, an additional FY2013 CIP is required and both CIPs will be used to leverage HUD ICDBG funds. Also, the Tribe will be applying for Indian Health Services Tribal Equipment Funding for clinic equipment funding.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

In August 1994, the village of Allakaket had a devastating flood. The whole village had to be rebuilt. All homes and public buildings were replaced with temporary structures. In the case of the clinic, the building was not built to arctic weather standards and the Denali Commission has recommended that it be replaced. The current clinic has no water and services and no itinerant quarters. While replacement of the existing clinic is the ideal choice to provide improved primary health care services to Allakaket residents, the City realizes that Denali Commission's new clinic funding is no longer available. As a result, the City and Tribe are working with the Tanana Chiefs Conference and ANTHC to conduct an existing clinic rehabilitation project at a cost of \$920,000. This project will rehabilitate the existing clinic and will extend water and sewer services from the village's washeteria/water treatment plant.

While the Allakaket Traditional Council has received a FY2011 CIP in the amount of \$150,000 which was titled "Allakaket Headstart/Clinic Facility", this CIP title is no longer an appropriate designation due to the fact that the Allakaket HeadStart program has found adequate facility space in the village and as a result, the Tribe requests that this CIP appropriation be re-titled to "Allakaket Clinic Rehabilitation Project". In addition, the Allakaket Traditional Council and the City of Allakaket has worked with the Tanana Chiefs Conference to update the cost estimate to rehabilitate Allakaket's existing clinic and extend water/sewer services and have determined that an additional \$150,000 is required above the current available funding for this clinic renovation project.

The Allakaket Traditional Council hereby respectfully requests two Legislative CIP actions for Allakaket:

- 1) Redesignate Allakaket's FY2011 CIP in the amount of \$150,000 which was titled Allakaket Headstart/Clinic Facility to

"Allakaket Clinic Rehabilitation Project".

2) Provide a new Legislative CIP appropriation in the amount of \$170,000 for purposes of implementing the "Allakaket Clinic Rehabilitation Project" during 2012-- 2013.

The Tribe and City will utilize the above requested CIPs to leverage \$600,000 in federal funding from HUD's Indian Community Development Block Grant(ICDBG)which an application has been submitted and is pending award April, 2012. This pending ICDBG requires "match" funding in the amount of \$320,000 which the above requested CIPs will fulfill.

The City has reviously obtained a Legislative FY2011 CIP for \$150,000 and TCC will assist Allakaket to utilize the approved FY2011 CIP and the requested FY2013 CIP to leverage HUD Indian Community Development Block Grant, State Community Development Block Grant and Indian Health Services Tribal Equipment Fund (TEF)funding to complete the project budget so that construction can begin in 2013. Legislative CIPs are a crtical element of the funding applications in that they help the applications score more points on the "match" category.

Project Timeline:

Construction will begin fall, 2012.

Interior work conducted through winter of 2012/2013.

Water/sewer extension to be conducted summer, 2013.

Project completed fall, 2013.

Entity Responsible for the Ongoing Operation and Maintenance of this Project:

The City of Allakaket and Allakaket Traditional Council will share O&M expenses.

WHEREAS, it is the Allakaket Traditional Council's mission, purpose and vision is to improve the health and welfare of the residents of Allakaket, and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket Traditional Council operates and maintains the village's primary health care clinic, and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket clinic was constructed to inferior standards after the devastating flood of 1994 by FEMA and was originally intended as a temporary clinic, and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket clinic has no water and sewer services, is costly to heat, and has been contaminated in the past by a backed-up sewage system which is no longer functioning and has left the building contaminated, and

WHEREAS, there is also need to have itinerant quarters at the clinic to accommodate visiting health care providers, and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket Traditional Council is concerned that future Denali Commission for a new clinic at Allakaket is uncertain and that the Council has decided to seek alternative funding from the Alaska Legislature to be used as match for leveraging of funding from HUD's Indian Community Development Block Grant program (ICDBG) and the State's Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, and

WHEREAS, while the Allakaket Traditional Council has received a FY2011 CIP in the amount of \$150,000 which will be used for part of its match to leverage ICDBG and CDBG funding, the Council requires an additional \$150,000 in order to fully match expected these funding sources.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Allakaket Traditional Council hereby certifies that it has received and considered citizen comments and hereby declares that the planned Allakaket New Health Care Clinic Project is the village's top community development priority.



WHEREAS, it is the Allakaket Traditional Council's mission, purpose and vision to improve the health and welfare of the residents of Allakaket, and

WHEREAS, the City of Allakaket operates and maintains the village's primary health care clinic and which requires major renovation according to a 2009 Denali Commission funded "Code and Conditions Survey", and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket clinic has no water and sewer services, is costly to heat, and has been contaminated in the past by a backed-up sewage system which is no longer functioning and has left the building contaminated, and

WHEREAS, the Allakaket Traditional Council and the City of Allakaket have a cooperative relationship and desire to collaboratively renovate Allakaket's existing clinic and establish water and sewer services to the facility, and
