*Funding Details:**In FY 2012, the City and Borough of Wrangell received \$3,700,000 toward the goal of paving the entire Boat Yard.***Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

The City and Borough of Wrangell has been focused on diversifying its economy and creating jobs. Due to these efforts, Wrangell has experienced economic expansion in the marine industry and is one of only two communities in the Southeast region that have witnessed a recent increase in population.

The Wrangell Marine Service Center (Wrangell Boat Yard) has attracted businesses - both old and new - to invest their resources in Wrangell. Through these new business ventures, employment opportunities in Wrangell have increased, and many of these newly created jobs are those related to trades which have supported the mainstay industries historically known to Southeast Alaska.

Given previous project funds, the City and Borough of Wrangell have been able to develop the infrastructure within the Wrangell Boat Yard, through phased projects. To date, there has been an expansion of the underground utility infrastructure, and replacement of a portion of the fill in anticipation of paving the site, with the first phase of the concrete paving to begin in May 2012. This work will be a tremendous benefit to the operation of the Marine Travel Lift, boat yard operations, and seafood industry-related forklift activity. Additionally the safety level within the boat yard will be greatly improved once the remaining site undergoes similar concrete paving upgrades.
