Detailed Project Description and Justification:

This project will fund pavement overlay, rehabilitation, and replacement projects throughout the Senate District. Project priorities will be established by Street Maintenance, Traffic, and Project Management and Engineering, with input from elected officials and the public. Projects to be funded are primarily local roads, but some trail rehab is also anticipated.

This project has not started. State grant funding is proposed. Deteriorating pavement on Anchorage roads is increasing safety concerns and maintenance costs. Many of the local roads in Anchorage are showing their age and in many cases how poorly they were initially constructed. This program allows the Municipality to preserve the useful life of the road base and avoid much more expensive full reconstruction projects as well as improving the quality of life for residents.

The grant funding may be used for utility work, obtaining rights of way and easements, and any work associated with rehabilitating the streets in the Senate District and their amenities.
