**Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

Currently there is only one water main serving an area with approximately 200 homes. This project will add 120 linear feet of 12" ductile iron pipe. It will include pressure reducing valve and vault. This will allow the system to make a complete loop, improving fire flow volume and strengthen and support the Water Main Lines.

If a water valve were to malfunction, or if a water main broke or froze, this redundant looped system would ensure that the homes in the impacted area would continue to have water service. This will lead to better engineering practices.

**Project Timeline:**

If this project receives legislative funding, design work would begin upon funding notification in 2012, with construction to commence in the summer of 2013.

WHEREAS, the City conducted a substantial public process in 2011, including a project fair held on May 23, 2011, to allow public review and input on proposed capital projects; and




