Project Description/Justification:

The Waterfront Promenade Phase III is intended to provide expanded area for pedestrians. By providing a designated pedestrian path along the waterfront, pedestrians will be removed from the main traffic artery through Ketchikan. This project will also fulfill a longstanding goal to provide access to Ketchikan's waterfront, both for cruise passengers as well as for the community at large. This project is needed to widen and supplement existing pedestrian facilities along Stedman Street to keep tourists from spilling over the curb and onto the street. This project will reduce pedestrian-vehicle conflicts.
