Project Description/Justification:

The SWLRTPP is a policy-level plan developed to guide transportation policies, programs and investments and is the core element of the Statewide Long Range Transportation Plan required by 23 CFR 450.200-224 and AS 44.42.050. This update will conduct a multimodal system level analysis of Alaska's transportation infrastructure needs through 2035. The plan will address the State's responsibilities as the owner and operator of transportation modes such as highways, bridges, airports and ferries, and its supporting role in directing funding to public transportation system operators and local units of government for their transportation infrastructure. The completed plan can be used as a framework for developing future transportation planning documents, capital programs. and budget.
