Project Description/Justification:

The Yukon-Kuskokwim Correctional Center (YKCC) was constructed in 1984 and includes 25,000 square feet of space. This project will provide a fire pump transfer switch replacement (\$75,000) and a water filtration system upgrade (\$100,000) at the YKCC.

This project is from a compilation of essential capital requirements at this institution. A list of known projects is formulated in late October or early November each year. The actual list of projects is fluid between the time that the list is prepared and the time the appropriation is authorized. During this time period, other critical projects are identified with several of the already identified projects being completed. Funds are then allocated to the most urgent of the remaining projects. The projects that could not be accomplished become the basis of the next fiscal year capital appropriation request.

Adjustments to the allocated funding maybe necessary between all 24-hour institutional facilities to meet emergency needs as they arise.
