**Project Description/Justification:**

This was harbor transferred by the department to the City of Unalaska on June 4, 1993. This facility has been in use for nearly thirty years, and while routine maintenance has been performed, major repairs and replacements need to be done to extend the life of the harbor, to ensure the safety of those who use the harbor and the vessels that moor at the harbor. Corrosion within the concrete structure threatens the integrity of the entire facility. As the floats have aged, they have begun to lose their ability to float, and structural elements not designed to be in the water have become submerged, thereby accelerating the deterioration process. This is the only harbor devoted to small vessels in the community.

This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.
