Additional Information / Prior Funding History:

This is a new project with no previous funding.

Project Description/Justification:

Construction of a heated facility is needed to house the State Mobile Emergency Operation Center (MEOC) vehicle. This heated facility will provide protection for the MEOC's significant and sensitive electronic equipment and also position the vehicle for immediate deployment to a disaster scene.

This project serves a dual purpose that works to maximize the continuity of operations by the state: primarily the facility houses the MEOC but it can also be converted to an alternate state emergency operations center with the MEOC running communications from outside the facility. The facility will be built on existing State property in the Matanuska Susitna Borough. Prestaging the MEOC in the Matanuska Susitna Borough provides the state with the ability to deploy this valuable asset to secondary command locations via the road system in the event of losing the primary bridges to and from Anchorage.

Priorities and cost estimates may need to be changed to accommodate emergency projects not listed, actual project costs, and other considerations.
