## **Project Description/Justification:**

Lessons learned from the recent tsunami in Japan and the tornados of Joplin, Missouri emphasize the importance of preparing for and meeting the food and bulk distribution needs in a catastrophic disaster situation.

This request is to establish a "Strategic Catastrophic Disaster Food Reserve" to handle 30,000 displaced victims who would have little or no means of self-sustainment. This mass care feeding capability will be a critical life saving tool. The project will be designed to purchase and store 614,700 MREs and rapidly deploy them to coordinated jurisdiction points of distribution (POD) sites in a catastrophic emergency. This stop gap measure will provide immediate response relief to allow the affected jurisdiction time to open long term shelters and reestablish supply lines. Funding will also provide planning and coordination with the private sector and local authorities on crisis management, transportation, and logistics that will work to restore food supplies in stores, as this is a major step toward stabilization, recovery, and restoration.
