Project Description/Justification:

This harbor was transferred by the department to the City and Borough of Sitka (CBS) on June 18, 1992. Located close to the Alaska Native Brotherhood Hall, ANB Harbor has been a staple in the lives of Sitka residents since 1956. Despite numerous renovations and replacements through the early 1990's, the harbor has outlived its usefulness and needs to be replaced. Reports of broken stringers and bullrails throughout the harbor have necessitated numerous repairs by CBS harbor maintenance staff and other contractors, including "sistering" of structural members, decking and bullrail maintenance, and hinge and assembly replacement.

This project contributes to the Department's Mission by reducing injuries, fatalities and property damage and by improving the mobility of people and goods.
