This harbor was transferred by the department to the City of Petersburg on February 24, 2006. Few harbors can claim the heart and tradition of North Harbor. For nearly 75 years, North Harbor has been a staple of Petersburg's community. Centrally located in the heart of downtown, North Harbor is close to amenities and neighbors the three largest fish processors in the state: Icicles Seafoods, Ocean Beauty, and Trident Seafoods. North Harbor is one of the oldest harbors in Petersburg with some fishermen having their boat slips for over 60 years. The harbor was originally constructed in 1937 with subsequent phases completed in the 1960's and 1970's. A strong preventative maintenance program has allowed for continued usage past its intended design life. The city desires to replace the entire facility to ensure its fishing livelihood and the safe conditions for harbor patrons.
