### **Detailed Project Description and Justification:**

Four years ago, The Alaska Arts and Culture Foundation (AACF), in partnership with the Alaska State Council on the Arts, received funding from the Western States Arts Federation to host a series of meeting with Alaskans who care about arts and culture to discuss the importance of arts and culture and how long-term sources of support for arts and culture should be identified and made viable.Now, AACF would like to do a thorough assessment of what artistic and cultural opportunities and activities are provided to Alaskans, where, how and by whom. This needs assessment will provide a clear picture of Alaska's arts and culture resources -- where they are, what benefits they provide to their communities, how many jobs they provide.

What is a Cultural Trust? An arts and culture endowment, which is a private-public mechanism to enhance funding to communities, agencies and arts and culture organizations. Such a Trust will ensure that this sector serves Alaskans for generations to come, regardless of annual state appropriation to the Alaska State Council on the Arts. We envision that this is MUCH LARGER than the Alaska State Council on the Arts, and will not replace the appropriation.

The entities that we will survey include individual artists, arts organizations (including local arts agencies like the Fairbanks Arts Association), schools, universities, museums, libraries, historical societies, civic groups, Alaska Native corporations, IRA Councils, and many other nonprofit and state agencies.
