The sound system will consist of two major sections; a portable cart with audio equipment cable of independent operation in the music room, and a sound system permanently installed in the gym that will allow amplification of up to four microphones from the stage. When required for a musical concert, the audio cart can be moved to the gym and will plug into the gym system.

Benefits if Project is Funded

Students will be able to rehearse and refine skills in the classroom in order to put on a polished final performance. These include life skills such as public speaking as well as curriculum requirements of singing and performing for others. Students with young voices will be heard as well as students with a more mature and robust sound. The balance between instruments and voices can be adjusted for optimal quality. Instrumental parts will be able to be heard while others sing or play contrasting parts.

Impacts if Project is not Funded

Applause and recognition are huge motivators for children. When students work hard to put a wonderful performance and it receives a lackluster reception due to poor sound quality, their effort is minimized. An adequate sound system is vital for students' efforts to be appropriately appreciated.
