Brief Project Description:

Trailside Discovery Camp (TDC) seeks funding for the purchase of water safety curriculum, watercraft and a 15 passenger van to offer a water safety, and water craft programs this summer to the Boys & Girls Club in Mountain View. Funding will enable TDC to purchase safe, quality equipment that will be instrumental in getting this exciting new program up and running.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

In 2011, Trailside Discovery Camp (TDC) began broadening its scope by bringing two outdoor education staff directly to the Boys & Girls Club in Mountain View. The pilot program began last summer at the B&G Clubhouse, where children were able to participate in hands-on lessons in the outdoor classroom surrounding the club house. The popularity of this program has lead to the development of the water safety watercraft concept, which will be introduced for the summer of 2012 and will be available to all children of the B&G Club.

Trailside Discovery Camp's Water Safety, and watercraft program will bring water safety education and water craft outdoor recreation into the B&G club house next summer to reach children who might not have access to these experiences. Classes are all designed with learning objectives to support Alaska Boating Safety Program, the American Sailing Association standards of water safety, and follow American Camp Association standards of operation

Program Goals:

- Develop student awareness, understanding and appreciation for Alaska's cold water and the hazards it presents.
- Develop student awareness of the importance of wearing life jackets while on a boat or around the water.
- Provide students with the skills necessary for proper selection and use of life jackets.
- Encourage safe and responsible behavior when on a boat or participating in outdoor water-related activities.
- The program seeks to boost participants' confidence in their outdoorskills, develop healthy exercise habits, and foster outdoor pursuits.

This program is an important step toward increasing the number of children in Anchorage who are exposed to water safety and watercraft programs and outdoor education. While Trailside Discovery's current camp programs provide excellent opportunities for the children it serves, not all children in Anchorage are able to participate or have families who can provide outdoor recreational opportunities. By bringing the programs into the Boys & Girls Club in Mountain View, Trailside will be able to introduce hundreds of children to water safety and watercraft activities which will foster an excitement for outdoor adventures. Numerous studies have shown that Anchorage children are struggling with obesity. While this city is home to countless outdoor recreation opportunities, if children are not exposed to these activities by their parents, they might never have the chance to learn about them. The lessons they learn in the Trailside water safety and watercraft program will expose them to outdoor and recreation skills and outdoor adventure values that they will be able to use to make healthy choices as they grow into adults.

Trailside Discovery Camp has broad community support for this project and the expansion of its summer programs to include a water safety and watercraft component which will further expand and enhance the programs that are offered at the Boys & Girls Clubhouse. The Mountain View Community Council, Boys & Girls Club and The Anchorage sailing club have all provided letters of support for this program.

A unique opportunity exists to provide a program for Anchorage children, unlike any other offered in the district. At this very moment the bond is breaking between the young and the natural world, and a growing body of research links mental, physical, and spiritual health directly to our interactions with the outdoors. Through this program we will reunite the children of Anchorage with the natural world and help them to gain an understanding and appreciation that will inspire them to spend more time outside and active. By supporting this program in its early stages, the state will play a key role in promoting healthy lifestyles, developing outdoors skills and fostering a sense of outdoor adventure in the youth of Anchorage.

25 through the use of water safety courses, sailing, and kayaking, while also utilizing social and
26 emotional learning skills such as group initiatives, role play and communication skill building

28 challenges, and developing friendships that extend beyond the walls of their individual schools;

Established in 1982, Trailside Discovery began as a small camp of 250 students at Alaska Pacific University. The camp is now the largest outdoor education and adventure camp in Alaska and is located at the Campbell Creek Science Center in south Anchorage, on 740 acres of pristine wilderness. In the 2005 summer session, 1700 children, ages 4 -17, slogged through bogs, explored forests, treaded gently across trails, and learned about nature while being immersed in it. In addition to the summer programs, Trailside also offers a winter programs in December and March to coincide with the school district winter and spring break schedules.

The mission of the camp is to provide a broad range of outdoor education experiences for students of all ages and from all economic, social, and cultural backgrounds. Trailside Discovery offer campers a challenging, fun, and unique program based on the philosophy that the natural environment is an ideal site for community based learning. The Trailside Discovery experience provides children with nature-based opportunities, and assists them in developing the attributes that will later enable them to work alongside others in a non-adversarial and mutually beneficial fashion.


In addition to learning about science and nature, and developing leadership skills, campers also learn about stewardship. Service projects are a key piece of each camp program- in the past two years campers and staff have put in 1,000 hours of work on stewardship projects at the Campbell Creek Science Center, where the camp is housed. Campers have demonstrated that youth like to feel as though they are making a positive impact in their worlds, so campers spend a short part of each day planting trees, engaging in trail maintenance, or working on a stream bed erosion project. Even the youngest campers participate by watering the grounds and picking up litter.

Trailside Discovery creates an atmosphere that is conducive to expanding interest, appreciation, and knowledge of the outdoors. Natural science, history, outdoor skills and leadership are all emphasized. Trailside is a leader of youth development in the community, and we are willing to assist youth in becoming successful members of society. We strive to get all kids outdoors, and connected with nature. Trailside is proud to be a part of the Boys & Girls club of Mountain View, and excited to offer a water safety & watercraft program at the clubhouse.
