Funding Details:

Since 2010, Children's Meal Mission has received a legislative grant for 75,580, 25,000 in federal child nutrition funding, as well as an additional \$38,000 in individual and corporate funding.

Detailed Project Description and Justification:

Children's Meal Mission has served the Anchorage community since 2009. Based on data collected between 2010 and 2011, CMM has served more than 41,000 meals. These meals have been served throughout the Mountain View and Woodland Park (Spenard) communities in Anchorage.

Last year, we received a legislative grant in the amount of \$75,580. We believed, based on our strategic plan, that this funding would support our growth over the next two years, however, the need for our services has caused our growth to accelerate much faster than we anticipated. We intended to use those funds over two fiscal years in order to serve the 20,000+ meals those funds supported in 2011. Fortunately, the previous legislative grant funds came in time to serve three sites, and thousands of meals to hungry children in the Anchorage community.

It costs Children's Meal Mission approximately \$5.00 per meal to cook and serve each meal each day. The funding we are requesting this fiscal year is to support that growing need to feed hungry children. Children's Meal Mission has a goal to feed 200,000 meals, collectively between now and December 31, 2013. This legislative grant request will support serving thousands of meals throughout the Anchorage bowl, and hopefully throughout the state.



Children's Meal Mission Summary

Who We Are

Children's Meal Mission serves hungry children free meals, year round, at various convenient locations. CMM, Inc. serves a variety of hot, healthy, wholesome meals to ensure that children are receiving adequate nutrition during the school week.

Since November 2009, George Bell, a 20+ year veteran and professional cook, has served more than 40,000 meals to children in the Mountain View Community most of which he financed from his own pocket. Today, through the generous support of the Mountain View Boys & Girl Club director, the Woodland Park Boys & Girls Club, and the Anchorage Youth & Parent Foundation director, children & youth attend school fully focused on their work and not on their hunger. They have eaten healthy dinners just like the home-cooked meals we serve our own children. Here's how CMM started.

One day in the fall of 2009, George Bell dropped his son off to basketball practice at the Mountain View Boys & Girls Club. He noticed that there were quite a few kids playing in the facility, but no food was being served. The kitchen was closed up and there were no remnants of the smell of food in the halls. George remembered volunteering for Kid's Kitchen with Elgin Jones many years ago and wondered why was not still being served there.

George tracked down the director, David Barney, and asked about Kid's Kitchen. MR. Barney's response gave George pause. Kid's Kitchen had not served any meals at the Mountain View kids for years, and no one had come in and started the program back up. George felt that he had to do something. He came back and told the director he would serve dinner meals to the kids. He committed to serve food for a full year or until the Boys & Girls Club could find another person or agency to feed the children.


During the following year, George received some community support, as well as some financial support from the Food Bank of Alaska, but the majority of the food prepared and served was purchased by George. In the fall of 2010, George met Kokayi Nosakhere and Don Burrell. They were campaigning to End Childhood Hunger by 2015 in America. Don and George organized the nonprofit, and formally filed for nonprofit status in October 2010. In January 2011, the IRS formally recognized Children's Meal Mission as a tax-exempt 501 (c)3 nonprofit organization.

Today, 1 in 6 children in the State of Alaska are not receiving the daily nutrition necessary to live the normal, active life of a child. Children's Meal Mission wants to change that statistic. We currently serve approximately 125 hot, healthy meals daily at three sites. We intend to expand our services throughout the state serving as many of the 30,000+ hungry children in Alaska.

Children's Meal Mission/Stellar Management Partnership

Children's Meal Mission and Stellar Management have partnered to guarantee the maximum possible benefit to Alaska's children in meals served. Stellar Management is a local management company providing administrative services to CMM, Inc. to ensure CMM, Inc. can remain 100% focus on accomplishing its mission of feeding children hot, healthy meals.

Stellar Management fundraises, solicits and administers grants, provides support staff and coordination for fundraisers & events, volunteer coordination, and other administrative support.

Staff Growth

Children's Meal Mission has grown in multiple ways. In 2011, Children's Meal Mission hired for three positions: Full time chef, part time food service coordinator, and Food & Quality Control Specialist.

Our staff consists of:



George Bell, founder and chef prepares and serves the daily meals for both sites. He prepares the meals at the Mountain View Boys & Girls Club and serves the children from the same site. George has been preparing commercial quality food for more than twenty years.



Don Burrell Jr., Co-founder & Assistant Director is owner of Stellar Management and provides the bulk of the administrative, fundraising, and document services for Children's Meal Mission. Don has been with CMM since September 2010 and is the organization's liaison between partner agencies, grantors, government agencies, and vendors.



Vontreal Crump, Food Service & Delivery Supervisor delivers and serves meals at our second food service site. Vontreal started with CMM as a parent volunteer in late 2010, and was hired as staff in early 2011. She has continued to serve CMM sites as our "mother" making sure children & staff are always on task.



Gracy Larson, Food & Quality Control Specialist serves as CMM's fundraising and quality control guru. She has a background in childcare and has participated in one of the federally funded Child Nutrition Programs Children's Meal Mission participates in. She started with CMM as a parent volunteer, as well in the summer 2011. She has since been hired to support our food service sites, and in annual fundraising efforts.

Summer Food Service Program

Mountain View Boys & Girls Club

Since 2009, Children's Meal Mission (formerly Kids Meal Factory) has served free meals to children from the Mountain View Boys & Girls Club kitchen. We've serve breakfast, lunch, and dinner during the past two summers and will continue to serve dinner during the school year.

Our breakfast meal service times are between 7:30 & 8:30 during the school year (when served), and 9am to 9:30am

during the summer months. Our Lunch meal service is 12 noon to 1pm daily during the summer months. Our dinner meal service times range from 4:30 to 5:30 during the school year, and 4pm to 5:30pm during the summer months.



Woodland Park Boys & Girls Club

Woodland Park Boys & Girls Club was an exciting expansion that began in November 2011. Children's Meal Mission began serving dinner meals at the Boys & Girls Club because of the lack of food service in an area of town where many children were from low income households. Providing a centrally located site was essential in planning the expansion.

Anticipating a sharp increased in the number of meals we serve, Children's Meal Mission purchased several pieces of essential equipment that has allowed us to more efficiently serve the quality meals we've produced since 2009.



Alaska Youth & Parent Foundation

Alaska Youth & Parent Foundation was a second site Children's Meal Mission took on in November. Unfortunately, the volume of meals for this site was not an efficient use of Children's Meal Mission's resources and we were unable to continue serving meals at this site. We do hope that one day we will be able to serve sites like Alaska Youth & Parent Foundation again.

Building a better volunteer base

2011 was our first full year as a tax exempt 501(c)3 nonprofit organization. We spent the great majority of our time serving children, expanding our services, and learning more and more about the need for access to quality meals for our local hungry children.

With the time and effort we spent raising awareness of our cause, we recognized the overwhelming support in our community for not only contributing financially to support our mission, but also to individuals, families, and organizations willingness to volunteer their time to serve children in need.

We endeavor to dedicate more of our available time in 2012 to allowing more volunteers to use their resources and desire toward feeding children, period.

Expanding to serve more meals

To date, Children's Meal Mission has served well over 40,000 individual meals to children in the Anchorage community. While the communities support has been amazing, we still reach only a fraction of the 13,000+ hungry children in our community. This is not to mention our desire to expand statewide to serve the more than 51,000 children that daily do not receive adequate meals to sustain themselves.

As we move forward in 2012 we look forward to meeting the challenge of serving an additional 40,000 meals this year!

Anticipated growth

2012 will bring a number of increases to Children's Meal Mission. As we expand our services to provide more quality, hot meals to hungry children in Alaska additional resources will be required to meet the demand. 


