A RESOLUTION FOR REQUISITION OF HEAVY EQUIPMENT FROM THE STATE

CAPITOL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

WHEREAS; Alatna is recognized federally as a tribe; and

WHEREAS; the Alatna Traditional Council is the governing body for the Alatna Tribe, to act for and on behalf of the tribe; and

WHEREAS; Alatna has been granted contracts with the Bureau of Indian Affairs from the Indian Reservation Roads Program; and

WHEREAS; Alatna has inadequate heavy equipment to start the projects, maintain the existing roads and build planned roads in Alatna; and

WHEREAS; Alatna has been put on the lists for Federal Surplus Equipment, and Tanana Chiefs Conference heavy equipment availability list; and

WHEREAS; Alatna is requesting a D9 Dozer/Excavator, estimated cost is \$180, 000, 00, excluding the cost of shipment to the village; and

WHEREAS; Alatna will seek other funding for transporting any heavy equipment we are granted; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; the Alatna Traditional Council authorizes TCC and the State Capitol Improvement Projects departments to assist Alatna on requisitioning a D9 Dozer/Excavator in order to move forward with time sensitive contracts, and future construction needs.

The Alatna Traditional Council has entered into a contract with the United States of America Department of The Interior Bureau of Indian Affairs. This project is to design and acquisition activities associated with the purchase of a transit shelter and constructing a gravel pad to be placed upon, design of a shelter foundation (Koyukuk River Boat Landing, Project E0310A1) located in Alatna, Alaska. The Contractor will perform the Administration, design and associated activities of procuring the transit shelter.

This project will provide shelter for Alatna residents that traverse the Koyukuk River to Allakaket, where all local businesses are located, el. Post office, school, stores, gas station, and community hall. At times we get very rainy weather. After having to cross the river, the residents and visitors have to get to village with all terrain vehicles or trucks. Some of our residents have no means of transportation to get to their homes, therefore relying on relatives or the tribal staff for rides up the hill. This transit shelter would provide a place out of the weather. We plan to install a VHF radio for communication.

Alatna has inadequate heavy equipment to start project as scheduled. The existing dozer we own is 30 or more years old and has been repaired numerous times. Without a working dozer we are in a standstill on getting gravel to the proposed site. We were obligated an estimated total cost of \$42,344.00 from the FY'10 Highway Trust Funds. We are to furnish all labor, equipment, and materials to perform all contract work. In order to complete this project we will need a newer, bigger dozer.

We have existing roads that we received an award in the amount of \$15,805.00 for road maintenance for FY10, and have not been able to maintain our roads. We are in dire needs to repair most of our existing roads. All of our residents rely on these roads on a daily basis. We also have proposed roads in our roads inventory with the BIA IRR Department. Requisitioning a newer dozer will allow Alatna to move forward on our economic growth.

Alatna receives monies from the State of Alaska Community Revenue Sharing in the amounts of \$33,570.00 for FY10, \$33,842.00 for FY11 and \$33,992.00 for FY12. We planned to use these shares to build a playground/picnic area and to purchase fuel for our tribal buildings. When we do order diesel and gas for our tank farm, we will need a dozer to build an ice road to Allakaket, and then transport the fuel over with our fuel trucks. Without a dozer we usually rent one from Allakaket to complete project.
