Adj Base (FY14 Adjusted Base) - FY2013 Management Plan less one-time items, plus FY2014 adjustments for position counts, funding transfers, line item transfers, temporary increments (IncT) from prior years, and additions for statewide items (risk management and most salary and benefit increases). The Adjusted Base is the "first cut" of the FY2014 budget; it is the base to which the Governor's and the Legislature's increments, decrements, and fund changes are added.
