Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$639.3 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. Alaska is by far the largest of the states in geographical size with distances and obstacles to travel that are substantial and unique. Outside of Anchorage, Fairbanks and Juneau, the population of Alaska largely resides in literally hundreds of small towns and villages spread throughout a vast geographical area. Rural Alaska has special law enforcement needs that derive from its geographical size and the isolation of most of its rural communities where alcohol is the root of most criminal problems. While the effort to cut off alcohol availablility is underway, the intent of this proposal would be to aggressively prosecute crimes resulting from that availability, thus attacking the problem from two fronts. A special unit or team of prosecutors and paraprofessionals that would be available to provide assistance and support to the rural prosecution effort could have a significant positive impact on prosecutions in rural Alaska and, ultimately, reduce the level of crime in these communities.

This project will provide a flexible prosecution team available to provide back-up and assistance all over rural Alaska on an as needed basis. This team would consist of three prosecutors, a paralegal and a secretary in an office located in Anchorage. The prosecutors and paralegal would provide support to rural offices throughout the

The Department of Law leases office space in Anchorage for the Criminal and Civil Divisions under the terms of a joint lease of the Brady Building and the Whale Building. As the department has grown over the years additional lease space has only been available on a sporadic basis resulting in extreme overcrowding at times. The Department has recently been notified by the lessor that approximately 4,200 square feet of usable space will shortly be available in the Brady Building. The Department had intended to wait until the current lease expired in the Fall of 2009 to add additional space but, as stated above, the opportunity to obtain such additional space does not occur regularly and this or other space may simply not be available at the end of the current lease. It is opportune and wise for the Department to take advantage of this opportunity at this time. The additional square footage is estimated to cost \$200,000 per year - 55% is to be allocated to the Civil Division at a cost of \$110,000 per year and approximately 45% is to be allocated to the Criminal Division at a cost of \$90,000 per year.

Law is requesting a total of \$482,800 in general funds to replace funding reductions for drug prosecution. Ultimately, Law is expecting a reduction of as much as \$700,000 in funds passed from the Department of Public Safety to the Criminal Division for drug prosecution. Congress has been reducing its support for drug enforcement prosecution since 2005. Because federal funds carry forward between state fiscal years, the full effect of ratcheting down the funding will not be felt until state FY 2008. These grant funds paid for three attorneys, a paralegal and a law office assistant in Anchorage, one attorney in Palmer and one in Fairbanks, plus overhead costs associated with those offices in all three locations. The version of the budget bill that passed Congress severely reduces funds for this program but the full effect of the reduction for FY 2006 and FY 2007 will not be known until as late as March of 2006. Law is particularly concerned about the shortfall coming at the same time when the use and manufacture of methamphetamine is on the rise in Alaska. Meth presents a very real threat to Alaska as it has an addiction rate similar to that of crack cocaine (8 out of 10 persons trying meth once will become addicts) and can be cheaply made from household ingredients. Meth destroys the health of the user and makes the user paranoid and violent and increasingly likely to engage in deviant sexual behavior or abuse. Alaska is actively involved in the fight against illegal drugs. A potential funding reduction of \$700,000 in the Department of Law poses a clear threat to a successful fight. Continuing to prosecute drug crime is directly related to our mission statement and our goal to reduce violent crime in Alaska.

The Department of Law, Criminal Division will implement an automated notification system called VINE -- Victim Information and Notification Everyday. VINE is a computer-based service that currently offers prisoner custody status information. A person may register for the system to contact them if an offender's custody status changes by being released, transferred, or escaping. Additionally, currently planned upgrades to the VINE program will expand the notification to include update of any court hearings related to an offender.

One of the victims' rights under the Alaska Constitution is to be provided information about and be allowed to attend all criminal or juvenile proceedings where the defendant has a right to be present. Currently, this information is being provided through notification from the victim witness paralegals in each of the district attorney's offices. Making this contact each time a hearing date changes takes a significant amount of time. The

Increase statutory designated program receipts for consumer protection recoveries to allow the Civil Division's consumer protection program to obtain investigative services. Alaska is a target state for many types of consumer fraud. Under the authority of the Consumer Protection Act (AS 45.50.471 et seq.), the Commercial and Fair Business section investigates and brings enforcement action against businesses that engage in unfair or deceptive trade practices.

The Department of Law has increased enforcement activity due to additional statutory designated program receipt resources appropriated to this component beginning in FY2000 and increased again in FY2004. To help ensure receipt of this resource, the department needs to maintain the section's participation in multi-state investigation and enforcement activities involving national companies that have committed unfair or deceptive practices impacting Alaskan consumers.

To further enhance the department's consumer protection program, the section anticipates hiring a contract investigator to assist with local consumer protection enforcement efforts. The contract investigator will initiate and assist with investigations where there is a pattern of illegal conduct including in-field investigations of suspect businesses or business practices, interviewing witnesses, drafting subpoenas or civil investigative demands, and providing intelligence information to section attorneys with recommendations on future action.

The state and its citizens benefit significantly from the work done by the consumer protection program. The department's participation in consumer protection work not only protects Alaska's citizens, but also receives a

The Department of Law requests additional funding in the Natural Resources Section to pursue the Governor's statehood defense and natural resource development initiatives. These funds will be used to advocate for the state's right to access public lands and the right to develop state and private natural resources.

The success of the Governor's statehood defense and resource development initiatives requires a knowledgeable legal team. The positions will work with the Governor's Office and the state's resource agencies to challenge federal initiatives that unreasonably limit or delay responsible resource development, and will continue the state's aggressive advocacy of its rights through litigation.

An example of federal actions requiring state intervention are the currently ongoing revisions of federal land management plans. Active state involvement is important because these plan revisions will guide activities in and access through national parks, wildlife refuges (including ANWR), forests, NPR-A and BLM land in Alaska. Other examples include BLM proposals to vacate existing easements through ANCSA conveyances to public lands. And to preserve access on RS 2477 rights-of-way, the state will initiate quiet title actions against the federal government (for the purpose of planning requirements, Utah, another state aggressively seeking title to its RS 2477 rights-of-way, has tasked seven attorneys to gather evidence and prepare its RS 2477 cases for filing). For instance, section attorneys are engaged in multiple lawsuits and administrative proceedings involving federal Endangered Species Act decisions. As an example of a position the state takes in these actions, the state opposes listing healthy populations of animals based on speculative models of climate 100 years in the future; the state urges the use of shorter, more accurate time frames. In the timber arena, section attorneys are pursuing an

The Alaska Marine Highway System (AMHS) must file a lawsuit against the contractor responsible for the design and construction of the fast ferries Fairweather and Chenega. The suit will also name the companies responsible for the vessels' propulsion systems. AMHS must file suit now before the expiration of the statute of limitations.

Since AMHS accepted delivery of the vessels in 2004 and 2005, the propulsion systems have been subject to recurrent problems. Typical of the problems encountered with the vessels was the massive overhaul required on the Fairweather beginning in February 2006 at Ketchikan Ship and Drydock. All four diesel engines had hairline cracks in their steel sleeves, and there were additional problems with bull gears, shafts and bearings. If not addressed, the propulsion system problems will require continued maintenance, which will disrupt service, and will shorten the expected lifespan of the engines.

The lawsuit is against Robert E. Derecktor, Inc., the contractor responsible for the design and construction of the ferries, and against MTU Friedrichshafen, GmbH and MTU Detroit Diesel, Inc., the entities responsible for the vessels' propulsion systems.

Additional authority is requested to receive and expend \$66.1 in federal funds granted from the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance. The Department of Law (DOL) requests an appropriation for FY 2009 in the amount of \$4.7 million to pursue claims for penalties and lost revenues for the 2006 Prudhoe Bay pipeline spills and production shutdowns. DOL's current investigation, funded through the Response Fund, is ongoing but expected to be complete next fall. A limited tolling agreement with BP Exploration (Alaska), Inc. (BPXA) with regard to potential claims subject to a two year statute of limitations will expire as early as September 2008. While the investigation is not yet complete, DOL anticipates making a recommendation to pursue the state's claims. Expiration of the tolling agreement means that we will need to file a court case later this year or risk certain claims being time barred; hence this request for an appropriation to fund the anticipated litigation in FY 2009.

Based upon information gathered to date, DOL anticipates making a recommendation to commence litigation to recover the state's revenue losses, as well as civil penalties and damages under the state's environmental statutes. In March and August of 2006, crude oil leaked from oil transit lines (OTLs) operated by BPXA at Prudhoe Bay. In its Plea Agreement with the United States executed in October 2007, BPXA acknowledged that it "acted negligently by failing to adequately inspect and clean the OTLs." The company is "required to operate the OTLs as a reasonable operator." BPXA "did not expend sufficient resources to address the complex issues of corrosion in the OTLs." "BPXA failed to clean the OTLs with a piece of equipment called a maintenance (or cleaning) pig and inspect the pipe for corrosion activity with a smart pig." These admissions are borne out by our
