**20Adj Base (FY20 Adjusted Base)** - FY19 Management Plan less one-time items, plus FY20 adjustments for position counts, funding transfers, line item transfers, temporary increments (IncT) from prior years, and additions for statewide items (risk management and most salary and benefit increases). The Adjusted Base is the "first cut" of the FY20 budget; it is the base to which the Governor's and the Legislature's increments, decrements, and fund changes are added.

20GovAmdTOT (20GovAmdTOTAL) - Governor's February 13th budget plus all other Governor's FY20 requests. [2020 20GovAmd+2020 G OtherOp]
