Chapter 122

#### AN ACT

Making appropriations for the operating and capital expenses of state government; and providing for an effective date.

\* Section 1. Included within the general fund amounts appropriated according to the schedules in this Act, the following amounts are from the unreserved special accounts in the general fund:

Operating

Highway Fuel Tax Account

\$24,000,000

Aviation Fuel Tax Account

6,000,000

- \* Sec. 2. Federal or other program receipts that exceed the amounts appropriated in this Act are appropriated conditioned upon compliance with the program review provisions of AS 37.07.080(h).
- \* Sec. 3. If federal or other program receipts exceed the estimates appropriated by this Act, the appropriation from state funds for the affected program may be reduced by the amount of the excess if the reductions are not inconsistent with applicable federal statutes.
- \* Sec. 4. If federal or other program receipts fall short of the estimates appropriated by this Act, the affected appropriation shall be reduced by the amount of the shortfall in receipts.
- \* Sec. 5. If the federal receipts under Title XX of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1397 et seq.) fall short of the estimate, the amount of the shortfall is appropriated from the general fund.
  - \* Sec. 6. Amounts equivalent to the amounts to be received in -1-

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settlement of insurance claims for property losses are appropriated from the general fund to the affected agency for the purpose of replacing the facility or service lost as a result of the incident giving rise to the insurance claim.

- \* Sec. 7. The amount required to pay interest on revenue anticipation notes issued by the commissioner of revenue under AS 43.08.010 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Revenue.
- \* Sec. 8. The amount required to be paid by the state for the principal of and interest on all issued and outstanding state guaranteed bonds is appropriated from the general fund to the state bond committee to make all payments by the state required under its guarantee for principal and interest.
- \* Sec. 9. The sum of \$95,000,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education for school bond debt retirement.
- \* Sec. 10. The sum of \$5,565,600 is appropriated from the international airports revenue fund to the state bond committee for payment of debt service and trustee fees.
- \* Sec. 11. The sum of \$9,149,600 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Law to fund legal proceedings involving oil and gas revenues due or paid to the state or state title to oil and gas land, including, but not limited to, the North Slope Royalty Case (State v. Amerada Hess, et al), the Oil and Gas Corporate Income Tax Case (Arco v. State), the TransAlaska Pipeline Rate Case, litigation against the Alaska Oil Corpany, and United States v. Alaska, for fiscal year 1985 and succeeding fiscal years.
- \* Sec. 12. The sum of \$2,000,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Revenue for costs associated with the Oil and Gas Corporate Income Tax Case (Arco v. State) and oil and gas properties production tax cases for fiscal year 1985 and succeeding fiscal years.

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\* Sec. 13. The sum of \$250,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the oil spill mitigation account (AS 46.03.758(k)) for the oil pollution control program.

\* Sec. 14. The income of the Alaska permanent fund allocated annually to pay permanent fund dividends as provided in AS 43.23.045(b) is appropriated to the dividend fund (AS 43.23.045(a)) for the payment of the 1984 permanent fund dividend and administrative costs.

\* Sec. 15. The sum of \$7,985,700 is appropriated to the dividend fund (AS 43.23.045) from the net income of the Alaska permanent fund earned during the fiscal year ending June 30, 1983, for the payment of the 1984 permanent fund dividend.

\* Sec. 16. The sum of \$10,442,000 is appropriated from the general fund to the Department of Education for the Tobeluk Consent Decree to be allocated as follows:

Chapter 122, SLA 1984

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Under art. II, sec. 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law Conference Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 511, making appropriations for the operating expenses of State government. This bill is the product of an executive budget process begun last fall with state agency budget preparation and my personal review and approval of the product I submitted to the Legislature in January. Now the extensive review and delixiberation process has come full circle with my approval of this measure passed several weeks ago by the Legislature.

The phenomenal growth of the operating budget in recent years was possible only through the tremendous increase in our State's oil revenues. Between Fiscal Years 1980 and 1983, the State's General Fund operating budget doubled from \$955.6 million to \$1.929 billion. This year's operating budget, like that of last year, continues the recent trend of modest annual increases.

The primary implication of the State's long-term revenue forecast is one of warning - unrestrained growth in the operating budget will cause the State serious financial problems at some point in the future. To illustrate the importance of holding down the operating budget now, I have attached a chart which shows various operating budget growth rates against a steady revenue projection. It is clear that we cannot sustain the historical growth rate of

past years. In my administration, we have kept the operating budget growth to rate around 6.5%, which allows many more years of sustained operations within the framework of a balanced budget.

To avoid massive future State operating program cuts, we must continue to tighten our belts. Even if oil prices rise again, as a result of some world crises. State revenues will decline dramatically when production of the Prudhoe Bay field peaks in 1989 and then begins its predictable decline.

## Legislative Additions to the Operating Budget

I am, in general, very satisfied with the operating budget for State agency programs. However, I continue to be concerned with the number of appropriations added to the budget by the Legislature. As was the case last year, legislative additions fell into four general categories:

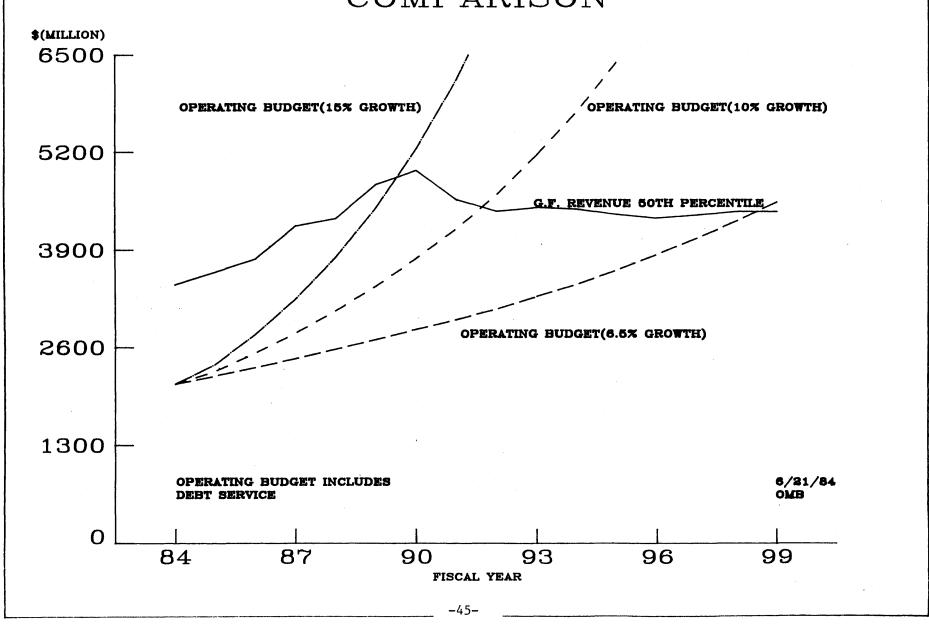
- appropriations increased over the agency request;
- appropriations made for a department request that was originally, intentially excluded from the operating budget I submitted to the Legislature;
- appropriations made to continue financing for a legislative addition enacted for a prior fiscal year; and
- 4. appropriations made for entirely new programs.

Some of these items were reduced or vetoed. for these actions are contained in the attachment, "Fiscal Year 1985 Legislative Additions Analysis."

Subject: SCS CSHB 635 (Fin) -- Making Special Appropriations to State Agencies for Development Projects and for Payment as Grants to Municipalities and Unincorporated Communities for Development Grants (Chapter 21, SLA 1984)

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law Senate Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 635 (Fin), making special appropriations to State agencies for development projects and for payment as grants to municipalities and unincorporated communities for development grants.

I have found it necessary to veto approximately \$84,000,000 from this measure. This reduction is substantially greater than those recorded in the other capital project measures -- the ones providing for schools, higher education facilities, erosion control projects, and sewer and water projects. My justification for this is simply that we have only so much money to spend on capital projects, and to me, the other measures contained more items of importance to the people of the state.

Mr. Speaker, I have found it particularly difficult to address the budget as a whole, both in view of the "piecemeal" approach to the assembling of the capital budget, and the fact that many items that are required in the total budget are still undetermined. I explained these concerns to the Cabinet in late February (see attached memorandum dated February 23, 1984), and I have stressed similar points to you and other members of the Legislature frequently over the past month.

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In reviewing this appropriation bill for development projects, I have tried to concentrate my deletions and reductions on projects of lower community priority, on projects that appear to be of lower statewide priority, and on projects that lack sufficient explanation or justification.

Capital Budgets/ Major Legislation

As you know, the Legislature is working on six separate bills appropriating general fund money for capital improvement projects in FY 1985. House and Senate leaders have said they intend to pass these six bills onto my desk by the 65th day of the session, or about March 10.

I have some problems with this approach to budgeting:

- A "piecemeal" approach to assembling the capital budget lends itself to even more confusion for public officials and the general public in sorting out requests for several hundred million dollars in annual projects.
- For the FY 85 budget year in particular, Alaska has many other major spending proposals that are not currently part of any budget bill being developed by the House and Senate Finance Committees. Examples of these major items include funds needed for purchase of the Alaska Railroad, as well as formation of a pool of financing in order to complete the "4-Dam Pool" and an Energy Policy for Alaska.
- The Legislature also has yet to begin an earnest debate of the Administration's proposal for a constitutional amendment creating the Major Projects Fund or of the legislative proposals for the 4-Dam Pool. Unless and until that debate begins, a final vote on other portions of the capital budget for FY 85 would be premature.
- As you know, the Administration also has requested the Legislature to authorize another \$400 million deposit to the Alaska Permanent Fund--money that would come from surplus revenues in the event that current estimates of our projected revenue next year prove to be conservative. Together with the Major Projects Fund, the added deposit to the Permanent Fund represents a commitment by the State to save as much money as possible for use by future generations of Alaskans.

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However, any discussion of this subject should include some mention of the following priority legislation being sought by the Administration:

- The Alaska Railroad--for \$22.3 million, the State can gain control over a key link in our transportation system. We support an appropriation bill for this purpose. The details of its operation are now being considered by the Legislature, and the Administration is working with the House and Senate to assure a smooth transition from federal to State control.
- The Permanent Fund--our day of reckoning is fast approaching. By 1990, oil production at Prudhoe Bay will be in a steep decline, and regardless of prices then, we expect to have significantly less revenue than we do today. For that reason, it is important that the Permanent Fund be protected and enhanced as much as possible. The Administration already has deposited \$300 million into the fund from an outstanding appropriation. Our request for an additional \$400 million represents our commitment to the welfare of future generations.
- The 4-Dam Pool--we have the opportunity and obligation this year to conclude and start an Energy Program for Alaska. Three bills are before the Legislature to accomplish this enormous task, each a part of the "4-Dam Pool" now being negotiated by the Alaska Power Authority and the communities of Ketchikan, Wrangell, Valdez and Kodiak. The three bills would provide \$35 million for a rate-equalization pool to assure the cost of hydroelectricity is no more than the cost of diesel-generated power to the affected communities; allow the State to sell electricity to large industrial users at a different rate, thereby providing cheaper power to residential users; and repeal the Susitna clause of current law, which mandates the commitment of

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\$5 billion to the Susitna project by 1991. Each of these bills is essential to the successful completion of power sales agreements for existing and future hydroelectric projects.

Finally, the Major Projects Fund--as you may know, I have proposed a constitutional amendment that would set aside 10 percent of our petroleum revenue each year for the next five years for dedication to a Major Projects Fund. We calculate the fund would accumulate between \$2 billion and \$3 billion by 1990. Under the proposed amendment, this money would be set aside for large (in excess of \$100 million in cost) projects that return a benefit to the State. Susitna is only one example of a project that might qualify; the port and road to the Red Dog Mine in Northwest Alaska is another. The need for a vehicle to store up dollars for these kinds of projects is obvious under our current system of capital budgeting. With this fund, there is no guarantee that any large-scale projects will ever be built. But without it, it is certain we cannot take any major steps toward diversifying our economy in the years ahead.

Subject: SCS CSHB 636 (Fin) -- Making Appropriations for Transportation Related Capital Projects (Chapter 22, SLA 1984)

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law Senate Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 636 (Finance). The bill is limited to projects that are transportation related.

Responsible use of public funds for transportation projects requires that I apply certain principles when evaluating projects in this bill. First, because transportation projects serve large geographic areas, it is essential that individual projects be coordinated to enhance the transportation network. To this end, I have relied greatly upon the planning and public review processes completed by organized cities and boroughs. have followed the recommendations of local governments There are some exceptions to this especially where the proposed project seems particularly suited for funding by a local government, not the State of Alaska.

Second, local government should be given flexibility for establishing the specific scope and location of a transportation project. In the past, the State of Alaska has been inconsistent in its approach to funding specific street, drainage, or other neighborhood improvements. In some instances, the specific project has been named in the

appropriation bill. In other instances, the appropriation has provided a lump sum for a general purpose to a local government. I much prefer the latter approach.

The reasons for taking this stand are simple and clear. By providing funds to a local government in a lump sum for a general purpose, the local government can use its existing procedures for identifying problems, selecting specific projects, and providing for appeals from aggrieved citizens. In addition, the local government can be held accountable for responsible use of these funds, an oversight function that is very difficult for the State of Alaska to carry out. In short, I wish to reinforce local government, not by-pass it.

I have applied this approach to local transportation projects included in this appropriation bill, and will apply it to SCS CSHB 691 (Fin) which is currently on my desk for review. I hope to gain your support, and that of the President of the Senate, for using these principles when developing future appropriations for local transportation projects.

Subject: SCS CSHB 637 (Fin) -- Making Special Appropriations to the University of Alaska for Capital Projects and for Payment as Grants to Municipalities and Unincorporated Communities for Post-Secondary Facilities (Chapter 23, SLA 1984)

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law Senate Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 637 (Fin), making special appropriations to the University of Alaska for capital projects and for payment as grants to municipalities and unincorporated communities for post-secondary facilities.

First, the title of the bill provides that some of the appropriations in the bill are made to municipalities and unincorporated communities. However, it does not readily appear from the text of the bill that any of the appropriations are made to a municipality or any other community. The recipients of the appropriations appear to be community colleges that are a part of the University of Alaska.

I have found it necessary to veto \$6,170,000. This is roughly 21 percent of the total general fund appropriation for University projects in this bill. During my review of appropriations to the University of Alaska, I have given high priority to those items that were requested by the University Board of Regents.

In this bill, I also supported many appropriations that address basic requirements of the University. Basic requirements include necessary repair and renovations and instructional or administrative equipment.

During my review of University of Alaska projects, I was somewhat concerned with the "haphazard" approach to funding University capital projects. Perhaps in the future, we can work together to take a more comprehensive approach toward funding University facilities and other capital projects.

Subject: SCS CSHB 691 (Fin) -- Making Special Appropriations for Capital Projects (Chapter 24, SLA 1984)

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law Senate Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for House Bill No. 691 (Fin), making special appropriations for capital projects.

I have found it necessary but extremely difficult to veto approximately \$108,000,000 worth of projects from this measure. It was difficult because I felt I had to strike or reduce school projects, health facilities, road and airport projects — things that I would normally like to approve. But, I had to do this because the combined total of approved projects — projects enacted into law this session in seven capital appropriations — is slightly more than \$700 million, the amount I recommended for such projects this past January.

In reviewing these seven bills, I was impressed by the breadth and depth of work put into the budgets by members of the House and Senate, as well as community and municipal leaders. I believe Alaska will be a better place to live and work as a result of the \$700 million in public improvements adopted by the Alaska Legislature and signed into law during the first 85 days of this session.

Unfortunately, you had only 65 days, and I had only 15 days in which to act on a total of nearly \$950 million in appropriations. As a result, not every community or statewide priority was encompassed by this package of legislation. For that reason, some community priorities were overlooked by the Legislature and others fell to my

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vetoes. Where mistakes or omissions were made, I look forward to working with you and the Senate leadership to rectify the situation.

Toward that end, I suggest we need to sit down and identify the necessary projects that must be funded by the State during this session, subject to available revenue and local or statewide importance. I firmly believe we have more than enough time remaining under the deadlines established by you and President Kerttula to work cooperatively on vitally important issues of public policy and finances.

Re: Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 94 (Fin) (An Act making special appropriations for capital projects; and providing for an effective date.) Chapter 45, SLA 1984

Dear Senator Kerttula:

I am today signing into law CSSB 94 (Fin), appropriating funds for capital projects. I have reduced the amount of general funds appropriated by this bill to \$50.7 million, through my line-item veto authority.

With these projects becoming law today, the 1984 session of the Alaska Legislature has appropriated and I have approved \$765.7 million in general funds and \$180.3 million in federal and other funds for a total of \$946.2 million in capital project funding so far. These projects will help make Alaska a better place for all residents, and it's a privilege to work with the Legislature toward that goal.

But, while it's important to fund projects such as those contained in this bill, several critical issues remain to be addressed by the Legislature before adjournment of this regular session. Since many of these critical issues will have significant fiscal impact, I've found it necessary to exercise once again my veto over a fair number of projects in this bill. The total is \$179 million.

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The pending issues which I am concerned about, and which I believe should now get the full attention of the Legislature in the remaining days of the session, include:

--Funds for operation of state government in Fiscal Year 1985, including loan programs, state revenue sharing and municipal assistance, debt retirement and negotiated employee contracts.

--State acquisition of the Alaska Railroad, a vital link in our transportation system for the Railbelt Area and an important part of our efforts to diversify the Alaska economy.

--The Major Projects Fund, which would reserve 10 percent of our oil income for the next six years to pay for public works projects needed to diversify the economy.

--The Four-Dam-Pool legislation, which would resolve a pending \$200 million debt for construction of hydroelectric dams in Southeastern and Southcentral Alaska, as well as give us a good start toward a statewide energy program for Alaska.

--Authorization for additional payments to the Alaska Permanent Fund, which would give us greater flexibility to deal with the expected decline of revenue from Prudhoe Bay in the years ahead.

These five issues, among others, have the potential for making this session of the Legislature one of the most productive and worthwhile in recent memory. They also will affect, of necessity, our fiscal outlook for FY85 and beyond.

Because of that, I believe they should be addressed before the Legislature considers adding to the already large amount of funds set aside for capital construction by the State. When these issues have been resolved, I look forward to reviewing the projects vetoed in this bill, but in the context of total appropriations and available

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revenue. I invite the Legislature to do the same because I would certainly like to see many of these vetoed projects eventually funded.

HCS CSSB 364 (Fin) -- Making Special Appropria-Subject: to Certain Communities and Municipalities for Erosion Control Projects, Chapter 18, SLA 1984

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law House Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 364 (Finance). This bill, which makes appropriations for erosion control capital projects, reflects the recommendations of a joint legislative and executive branch task force on erosion control. This effort should serve as a model for future programmatic appropriation bills.

As you are aware, I vetoed a number of erosion control capital appropriations contained within bills passed during the 1983 legislative session. The vetoes were not judgments on the value of each proposed project. Rather, the vetoes stemmed from a concern that erosion is a serious threat to both public and private property throughout Alaska, particularly in rural Alaska -- and as such, an erosion control program must be established that is systematic and addresses the greatest areas of need first.

I was pleased to obtain your support last year to establish such a program. During the summer and fall of 1983, staff from the offices of Senate members and the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities conducted a survey to identify erosion sites and establish an order of solutions. Appropriations contained within this bill were guided by the recommendations of the task force (with one exception that resulted in my only line item veto) and thus virtually eliminated controversy associated with the proposed projects.

I strongly endorse this approach to appropriating public funds. I look forward to working with you and the Speaker of the House of Representatives to identify other areas of capital or operating spending suitable for similar efforts. I believe cooperation between our two branches of government and the joint use of staff expertise will result in more equitable and more effective use of public funds.

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law House Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 403 (Finance), making special appropriations for capital projects associated with education facilities, libraries, museums.

I am generally pleased with the type of capital projects approved by the Legislature in this bill. It contains many projects necessary for the education of our school aged children throughout the State. I have found it necessary, however, to veto appropriations in the amount of approximately \$7 million. This is roughly 9 percent of the total appropriations. Even at this reduced level, the basic needs for health, life, and safety in our schools will be met and some educational and cultural programs will be enhanced.

I considered several criteria when reviewing this bill:

- 1. Projects must be for a public purpose and provide a direct benefit to the public rather that a private interest.
- 2. Projects should be financed through existing State programs and be required to satisfy established evaluation procedures. statutes have established an evaluation criteria for projects associated with elementary secondary education facilities. These criteria were used in my evaluation of school projects.

- 3. Projects must have a reasonable certainty of feasibility. They should have realistic cost estimates and at least a minimum level of planning and conceptual design. Specifications for education facilities must be adhered to in the design and construction of schools.
- 4. Projects should be of high priority for State funding. As such, they should be of high community priority and demonstrate both the support of the municipality and the local school board.

I am very pleased that information about all projects was readily available during my review and that the majority of school projects had been subjected to review and evaluation by the Department of Education. Those projects that were vetoed are generally those of low priority according to the Department of Education and, in most cases, the projects were also of low priority to the local school boards.

Subject: HCS CSSB 420 (Fin) -- Making an Appropriation to the Department of Environmental Conservation for Water and Sewer Grants, and Special Appropriations for Payment of Grants to Municipalities and Unincorporated Communities for Water, Sewer, and Solid Waste Grants, Chapter 20, SLA 1984

Under Article II, Section 15, of the Alaska Constitution, I have signed into law House Committee Substitute for Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 420 (Finance), making appropriations to the Department of Environmental Conservation for water and sewer grants, and special appropriations for payments as grants to municipalities and unincorporated communities for water, sewer, and solid waste grants.

I am generally pleased with the statewide distribution of funds to meet the need for water and sewer capital projects. However, I am concerned about a growing trend to bypass the Department of Environmental Conservation, Facility Construction Division, for administration of these projects. Department of Environmental Conservation personnel are able to provide valuable analysis of both project feasibility and long-term operating costs of water and sewer projects. I would hope that you would rely more on their expert management in future water and sewer capital appropriations.

Projects were vetoed for the following basic reasons:

- 1. I vetoed projects that would establish local reserves for unspecified water and projects.
- I vetoed projects that appear as low priorities 2. on a total statewide need basis.
- 3. I vetoed projects that appear to provide duplicate funding.

In general, appropriations in this bill meet many basic needs for water and sewer projects throughout Alaska. It is my hope that in the future we can work together to identify and fund water and sewer projects comprehensive fashion rather than on a piecemeal basis and fund that comprehensive program through the appropriate State department.

# Dear Representative Hayes:

I have today approved House CS for CS for Senate Bill No. 409 (Finance) am H (reengrossed). However, under art. II, sec. 15 of the Alaska Constitution, I have vetoed a total of \$101.6 million in capital projects and operating items from this bill. These reductions are summarized below and explained in detail in the attached veto analysis.

In general, my review and approval of appropriations in this bill was based on policy considerations consistently used during my Administration. Restated again, they are:

- Projects should be for high priority public purposes. Local projects should be of a high community priority; State and regional projects should be focused on those facilities of lasting importance to a broad region or area of the state.
- Capital projects must be for a public purpose and should provide a direct benefit to a public rather than a private interest.
- Projects when possible should be financed through existing State or local programs. Where statute or policy establish an evaluation procedure for projects of a certain type, all projects of that type should be expected to undergo the same scrutiny and compete openly for funds.

The impact of projects having significant new or long-term policy implications should be carefully considered prior to inclusion in any budget or appropriation measure. Those projects budgeted and appropriated for should have a reasonable certainty of feasibility. They should be supported by realistic cost estimate, adequate planning, and conceptual design.

Relating to the issuance of tax-exempt, state-guaranteed revenue bonds by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to finance mortgages for qualifying veterans under AS 18.56; and providing for an effective date.

\* Section 1. For the purpose of assisting the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation to provide money for the purchase of mortgages made for residences for qualifying veterans under AS 18.56, tax-exempt revenue bonds of the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation are unconditionally guaranteed as to principal and interest by the state in the principal amount of not more than \$700,000,000. The full faith, credit, and resources of the state are pledged to the payment of the principal of and interest on these bonds, and the principal of and interest on the bonds are secured by the general obligation of the State of Alaska. A statement of this pledge must be printed on the face of the bonds and must be signed in manual or facsimile form by the governor. The provisions of AS 37.15 do not apply to the bonds. The bonds shall be sold by the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation under AS 18.56 at public sale in amounts and at times approved by the state bond committee. The guarantee authorized by this section is in addition to the guarantees authorized by sec. 5, ch. 35, SLA 1982, and by sec. 1, ch. 81. SLA 1983.

### AN ACT

Authorizing the construction of the Knik Arm Crossing and relating to the acquisition, construction, equipping, and maintenance of toll facilities funded by revenue bonds and providing toll collection authority.

\* Section 1. AS 37.15 is amended by adding new sections to read:

ARTICLE 4. TOLL FACILITIES REVENUE BONDS.

Sec. 37.15.610. BOND AUTHORIZATION. For the purpose of providing part or all of the money to be used, with or without any grants or other money that may become available, the issuance and sale of revenue bonds of the state in the total principal sum of not to exceed \$500,000,000 is authorized to acquire, construct, equip, and install the additions, improvements, extensions, and facilities authorized in AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730. The principal of and interest on these bonds are paid out of and secured by the gross revenues derived by the state from the ownership, use, and operation of the toll facilities, and out of any other revenue or money that the state legislature may provide exclusive of any state tax or license. Bonds may not be issued to assist in the acquisition, financing, or operation of projects without prior approval from the legislature.

Sec. 37.15.620. CONSTRUCTION FUND. (a) The toll facilities construction fund is established for deposit of proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized by AS 37.15.610 and any grant or other money

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that is legally provided for the same purposes for which the bonds are authorized except for any accrued interest paid on the bonds by the purphaser. The money in the construction fund is used to pay the cost of acquiring, constructing, and equipping facilities authorized in AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730 and costs incidental to those activities, including costs of the authorization, issuance, and sale of the bonds. To the extent allowed in the bond resolution, money in the construction fund may also be used for the payment of interest on the bonds during the time of actual construction, and for any additional time, not exceeding one year after construction is completed. Money in the construction fund may also be transferred to the bond redemption fund, as permitted by the bond resolution, to establish a reserve for the payment of the principal and interest on the bonds.

(b) The bond resolution may provide for the investment of money in the construction fund as the committee determines. The interest earned upon or any profit derived from the sale of the investment is deposited in the construction fund.

Sec. 37.15.630. REVENUE FUND. (a) The toll facilities revenue fund is established and shall be set apart from all other money of the state. The toll facilities revenue fund is a trust fund for the purposes under AS 37.15.610 - 37.15.760, where all revenue, fees, tolls, charges, and rentals are deposited that are derived by the state from the ownership, lease, use, and operation of the facilities authorized by AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730. The revenue, fees, tolls, charges, and rentals may not include the proceeds of any state tax or license. The money in the revenue fund may only be used to

provide money to acquire, construct, and equip facilities authorized by AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730 and to be payable out of the revenue fund;

- (2) pay the normal and necessary costs of maintaining and operating the facilities acquired, constructed, or equipped under AS 37.15.610 37.15.760;
- (3) pay the costs of renewals, replacements, and extraordinary repairs to facilities acquired, constructed, or equipped under AS 37.15.610 - 37.15.760;
- (4) redeem before their fixed maturities any and all revenue bonds issued for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, and equipping facilities authorized by AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730;
- (5) provide money to acquire, construct, and equip necessary additions and improvements to facilities authorized by AS 37.15.720 and 37.15.730; and
- (6) provide money to pay any and all other costs relating to the ownership, use, and operation of the facilities.
- (b) The investment of money in the revenue fund may be made as the committee determines. The interest earned upon or any profits derived from the sale of an investment under this subsection shall be deposited in the revenue fund.
- Sec. 37.15.640. BOND REDEMPTION FUND. The toll facilities revenue bond redemption fund is established for deposit in trust of money for paying and securing the payment of principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on bonds and is set apart from all other money of the state. The committee, on behalf of the state, shall obligate the state to set aside and pay into the bond redemption fund from the revenue fund an amount of money sufficient to pay the principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds

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as the payments become due and, if the committee considers it necessary, to set aside and maintain a reserve for this purpose. The bond redemption fund is drawn upon for the purpose of paying the principal of and interest and redemption premium, if any, on the bonds, and the bonds do not constitute a general obligation of the state.

Sec. 37.15.650. BOND TERMS. (a) The toll facilities bonds are sold in the amounts or series and at the time as determined by the committee. Before selling a series of bonds, the committee shall give notice inviting sealed bids. If satisfactory bids are received, the bonds offered for sale are awarded to the highest responsible bidder. If the committee determines that a bid received is not satisfactory as to price or responsibility of the bidder, the committee may reject the bid received. Bonds, or a series of bonds, may not be sold if the effective interest rate over the life of the bonds exceeds 11 percent per year or that rate of interest that is 125 percent of the rate of the Bond Buyer Index of 20 Municipal Bond Average Yields for the week previous to the date of sale of the bonds, whichever is higher. Interest is payable annually or semiannually.

- (b) The bonds mature at the time fixed by the committee. The bonds may be subject to redemption before their fixed maturities as determined by the committee and with the premium fixed by the committee, but a bond may not be subject to redemption before its fixed maturity date unless the right to redeem that bond is expressly mentioned on the face of the bond. The bonds
  - (1) may be in denominations determined by the committee;
- (2) may be issued in coupon form or in fully registered form, and may be registrable as to principal or both principal and interest, all under regulations and conditions the committee provides;
  - (3) are payable as to principal and interest at the place

determined by the committee;

- (4) shall be signed on behalf of the state by the governor and shall be attested to by the lieutenant governor, both of which signatures may be facsimile signatures, and each of the interest coupons attached to them shall be signed by the facsimile signatures of these officials:
- (5) shall have the seal of the state impressed, printed, or lithographed on them: and
- (6) shall be issued under and subject to the terms, conditions, and covenants, providing for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds and the other terms, conditions, covenants, and protective features safeguarding this payment and relating to the maintenance, operation, and improvement of the toll facilities as found necessary by the committee, which covenants may include a provision requiring the setting aside and maintenance of certain reserves to secure the payment of the principal and interest.
- (c) If found reasonably necessary, the committee may select a trustee or trustees for the holders of the bonds or any series of the bonds, for the safeguarding and disbursement of any of the money in any of the funds created by AS 37.15.620, 37.15.630, and 37.15.640, or for the duties for authentication, delivery, and registration of the bonds as the committee may determine. The committee shall also fix the rights, duties, powers, and obligations of the trustee or trustees.
- (d) In the committee's determination of all of the matters and questions relating to the issuance and sale of the bonds and the fixing of the maturities, terms, conditions, and covenants of the bonds as provided in (a) - (c) of this section, the decisions of the committee shall be those found to be reasonably necessary for the best

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interests of the state and its inhabitants, and those that will accomplish the most advantageous sale of the bonds, with due regard, however, (1) to necessary or normal costs of maintenance and operation; (2) to renewals and replacements of and repairs to the toll facilities; (3) to all improvements to toll facilities and property of toll facilities owned, used, operated, or leased in connection with toll facilities; and (4) to the future growth and expansion of all of the facilities and the possibility of additional revenue bond financing for toll facilities purposes. A decision of the committee, as expressed in any bond resolution, is final when any bonds have been issued under the bond resolution.

- (e) A bond resolution may provide that the bonds issued contain a recital that they are issued under AS 37.15.610 37.15.760, and any bonds containing this recital are conclusively considered to be valid and to have been issued in conformity with AS 37.15.610 37.15.760.
- (f) The validity of the authorization and issuance of bonds is not affected by any proceeding for the acquisition or construction of the additions, improvements, or facilities for which the bonds have been issued or by any contract in connection with the acquisition or construction.

Sec. 37.15.660. BOND RESOLUTION. The committee is authorized and directed to adopt the bond resolution and prepare all other documents and proceedings necessary for the issuance, sale, and delivery of the bonds or any part or series of them. The bond resolution shall fix the principal amount, denomination, date, maturities, place or places of payment, rights of redemption, if any, terms, form, conditions, and covenants of the bonds or each series of them. The committee shall also determine and provide for the date and manner of sale of the bonds, and shall provide whether the notice of sale is to be HCS CSSB 347(SA) am H

published elsewhere in addition to the publication required by AS 37.-15.650.

Sec. 37.15.670. ENFORCEMENT BY HOLDER. The holder of any bonds or the trustee for the holders of the bonds or any series of them, may, by appropriate proceedings in the courts of record of the state, compel the transfer, setting aside, and payment of money and the enforcement of all of the terms, conditions, and covenants as required and provided in AS 37.15.610 - 37.15.760 and in the bond resolution.

Sec. 37.15.680. AMOUNTS REQUIRED FOR PAYMENTS. The committee shall, before December 31 of each year, commencing with the year in which the bonds are issued, certify to the commissioner of revenue and the commissioner of transportation and public facilities the amounts required in the next ensuing calendar year by a bond resolution to be paid out of the revenue fund into the bond redemption fund and to be paid into and maintained in any reserve fund or account or any other fund or account created by a bond resolution. The committee shall also certify to the commissioners the last date upon which payments may be made.

Sec. 37.15.690. BOND NEGOTIABILITY. The bonds and the coupons attached to them are fully negotiable instruments under the laws of the state.

Sec. 37.15.700. REFUNDING. (a) The bonds or any part of them may be refunded at or before their maturity by the issuance of refunding revenue bonds of the state if in the opinion of the committee refunding is advantageous to and in the best interest of the state and its inhabitants.

(b) The issuance of refunding bonds need not be authorized by an act of the legislature, and the committee shall adopt the resolution and prepare all other documents and proceedings necessary for the

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issuance, exchange or sale, and delivery of the bonds. All provisions of AS 17.15.610 - 37.15.760 applicable to revenue bonds are applicable to the refunding bonds and to the issuance, sale, or exchange of the bonds, except as otherwise provided in this section.

If a project requires financial assistance from the state, the state financial assistance must be available before bonds are issued for the project.

Sec. 44.88.174. REGIONAL RESOURCE ADVISORY COUNCIL. (a) Within 30 days after the authority adopts a resolution certifying that a project in the unorganized borough is eligible for financing under AS 44.88.172, the governor shall appoint a Regional Resource Advisory Council in the area of the state where the project is to be located and for which a regional housing authority has been established under AS 18.55.996. The purpose of a council is to assist the authority in reviewing a project that has been proposed for development in its area of the state.

(b) A Regional Resource Advisory Council consists of five members registered to vote in the region. The governor shall appoint the

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members to reflect the economic and geographic diversity of the region. Council members serve three-year terms at the pleasure of the governor, except that the initial members may be appointed for less than three years so that the term of at least one of the members expires each year. The governor shall appoint a chairperson who shall call meetings as required and preside over the deliberations of the council. A majority of the council constitutes a quorum for conducting the business of the council.

(c) Members of a Regional Resource Advisory Council do not receive compensation for their services on the council, but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses authorized by law for state boards and commissions under AS 39.20.180.

Sec. 44.88.175. REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO APPROVAL OF PROJECTS. (a) Before entering into an agreement to finance or to develop a proposed project with a cost in excess of \$10,000,000 that is financed under AS 44.88.172, the authority shall obtain the approval of each Regional Resource Advisory Council or municipality in the area in which the proposed project is to be located.
